YEAR 2 & FOUNDATION 2 4 WEEKS

NOTES

Lent an opportunity to start a new in order to celebrate Jesus' new life

The forty days of Lent is an opportunity for Christians to turn about from what is bad and to seek ways to do good by prayer and by doing something extra to prepare for the celebrate of Jesus' Resurrection at Easter.

Scripture: Micah 6: 8 *The lord told us what is good. What he requires of us is this: to do what is just, to show constant love, and to live in humble fellowship with our God.*

Catechism of the Catholic Church 1438: The seasons and days of penance in the course of the liturgical year (Lent, and each Friday in memory of the death of the Lord) are intense moments of the Church's penitential practice. These times are particularly appropriate for spiritual exercises, penitential liturgies, pilgrimages as signs of penance, voluntary self-denial such as fasting and almsgiving, and fraternal sharing (charitable and missionary works).

NOTES

Lent is part of the Liturgical Year when people unite themselves with Christ in order to grow in self-discipline through the practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We celebrate growth of new life in Christ, in preparation for the feast of Easter.

Scripture: Matthew 7: 1-6 Do not judge, so that you may not be judged. For with the judgement you make you will be judged, and the measure you give will be the measure you get. Why do you see the speck in your neighbour's eye, but you do not notice the log in your own.

Catechism of the Catholic Church 540: By the solemn forty days of Lent, the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert.

LENT/EASTER - GIVING: SACRIFICE - TOPIC OVERVIEW

YEAR 5 4 WEEKS
Lent, a time of giving in order to celebrate
the sacrifice of Jesus

NOTES

Lent is the season when Christians try to focus on giving. This helps us to identify with the complete sacrifice of Jesus which is remembered in the liturgy of Holy Week, especially the Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday – Easter Sunday.)

Scripture: Mark 10: 45 For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many. Catechism of the Catholic Church 2100: Outward sacrifice, to be genuine must be the expression of spiritual sacrifice: 'The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit...' The prophets of the old covenant often denounced sacrifices that were not from the heart or not coupled with love of neighbour. Jesus recalls the words of the prophet Hosea: 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice.' The only perfect sacrifice is the one that Christ offered on the cross as a total offering to the Father's love and for our salvation. By uniting ourselves with this sacrifice we can make our lives a sacrifice to God.

YEAR 6 4 WEEKS

Celebrating Jesus' death and resurrection

NOTES

For Christians, it is through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus that new life begins. He reveals the way to eternal life for us and so a new life begins here and now, a life which will culminate in future glory. The Lenten journey is one which takes us to the glory of Easter Sunday, from death to new life.

Scripture: John 12:24 Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies it bears much fruit.

Catechism of the Catholic Church 638: 'We bring you the good news that what God promised to the fathers, this day he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus.' The resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith in Christ, a faith believed and lived as the central truth by the first Christian community; handed on as fundamental by Tradition; established by the documents of the New Testament and preached as an essential part of the Paschal mystery along with the cross: Christ is risen from the dead! Dying, he conquered death; to the dead, he has given new life.
