'Liturgical services are not private functions but are celebrations of the Church which is the sacrament of unity, namely, the holy people united and organised under the authority of the bishops.'

POINTS TO REMEMBER

NOTES

The scriptures are the treasured Word of God for the Jewish and Christian communities. The books used by the Christian community record and hand on its story. The lectionary which is used at Mass contains the scriptures used by the community throughout the year.

Scripture: Luke 1:1-3 Many people have done their best to write a report of the things that have taken place among us. They wrote what we have been told by those who saw these things from the beginning and who proclaimed the message.

Catechism of the Catholic Church 104: ...in the sacred books, the Father who is in heaven comes lovingly to meet his children and talk with them.

NOTES

The Christian life is about journeying with Christ and sharing his way of life. The Church's year celebrates the key elements of Christ's life. Scripture: Psalm 23:4 (22) He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

Catechism of the Catholic Church 1344: Thus from celebration to celebration, as they proclaim the Paschal mystery of Jesus 'until he comes', the pilgrim People of God advances, 'following the narrow way of the cross' towards the heavenly banquet, when all the elect will be seated at the table of the kingdom.

YEAR 5 4 WEEKS

NOTES

Continuing Jesus' mission in diocese (ecumenism)

The Church, the Christian family, is made up of smaller Christian families called dioceses. Each diocese is led by a bishop. The bishops continue the work of 'the twelve' the apostles who continued the work and mission of Jesus. Jesus is the head of these families. He is the head of the Church. There are other Christian families which are not part of the Catholic Church. Ecumenism is the word used for promoting unity among Christian churches. One of the final prayers of Jesus was that we all might be one.

Scripture: Mark 3: 13-15 Jesus went up the mountain and called to him those whom he wanted, and they came to him. And he appointed twelve, whom he also named apostles to be with him, and to be sent out to proclaim the message and to have authority to cast out demons.

Catechism of the Catholic Church 849: The missionary mandate. "Having been divinely sent to the nations that she might be 'the universal sacrament of salvation,' the Church, in obedience to the command of her founder and because it is demanded by her own essential universality, strives to preach the Gospel to all."

YEAR 6 4 WEEKS The Bible, the special book for the Church

NOTES

The Bible is the story, spread over more than two thousand years, of God's love and how God's people responded to that love. There are all sorts of people – good, bad and indifferent – just as in the world today. God showed his love for them by wonderful deeds and each responded in a special way. There are all kinds of writings and the authors all wanted to tell us one thing: the truth about God. All of them were inspired by the Holy Spirit when they were writing. This is why the church family believes that the Holy Spirit is also the author of the Bible.

Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 2:13 We also constantly give thanks to God ... that when you received the word of God that you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word but as what it really is, God's word which is also at work in you believers.

Catechism of the Catholic Church 104: In Sacred Scripture (the Bible) the church constantly finds her nourishment and her strength, for she welcomes it not as a human word, 'but as what it really, is the word of God'. 'In the sacred books, the Father who is in heaven comes lovingly to meet his children, and talks with them'.
