NOTES

Christians believe that life is God's gift. all that makes up life – people, the earth, places, things – are part of that gift. we appreciate and wonder at the understanding that all is gift. there are two concepts of wonder, in reference to thinking and the wonder of our world. Both are necessary but worth noting as a possible area of misconception for the children. some children's knowledge/experience of our world may only be their immediate surroundings (i.e. home/street etc.).

YEAR 3 4 WEEKS

Special places for Jesus and the Christian community

NOTES

The Christian community has many special places: places where people gather for prayer and worship; places are holy because of their association with Jesus or holy people; places of pilgrimage.

Scripture: (Ephesians 2: 20-22) You too are built upon the foundation laid by the apostles and prophets, the cornerstones being Christ Jesus himself. He is the one who holds the whole building together and makes it grow into a sacred temple dedicated to the Lord. In union with him, you too are being built together with all the others into a place where God lives through his Spirit.

Catechism of the Catholic Church 2691: Pilgrimages evoke our earthly journey towards heaven and are traditionally very special occasions for renewal in prayer. For pilgrims seeking living water, shrines are special places for living the forms of Christian prayer 'in Church'.

UNIVERSAL CHURCH-WORLD-GOD'S PEOPLE-TOPIC OVERVIEW

Year 4	Topic title: GOD'S PEOPLE Different saints show people what God is like.	Length of topic: 4 WEEKS
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Teachers' notes

Introduction: Communion of Saints" is the collective name given to all members of the Church community, whether living or dead. Some members of the Church family are named as martyrs or saints. Martyrs are people who have given their lives for their faith, saints are people who have lived in God's way. They show us what God is like – loving, faithful, forgiving, caring for others and God's world.

Scripture: We have only one body, but we are made up of many parts, and all these parts have different functions. In the same way, though there are many of us, we are one body in union with Christ and we are all joined to each other as different parts of one body (Romans 12:4–5).

Catechism of the Catholic Church 2013: All Christians in any state or walk of life are called to the fullness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity. All are called to holiness: "be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect". In order to reach this perfection, the faithful should use the strength dealt to them by Christ's gift, so that doing the will of the Father in everything, they may wholeheartedly devote themselves to the glory of God and to the service of their neighbour. Thus, the holiness of the people of God will grow in fruitful abundance, as is clearly shown in the story of the Church through the lives of so many saints.

Year 6	Topic title: COMMON GOOD Work of Christians for the good of all.	Length of topic: 4 WEEKS
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Teachers' notes:

Introduction: The common good is central to Catholic Social teaching and is intrinsically linked to social justice. At the heart of this teaching is respect for the human person made in the image of God; the social well-being and development of all; peace between all peoples; understanding of the equality of all and respect for difference; human solidarity and an awareness of being part of God's global family.

Scripture: Micah 6:8 "This is what the Lord asks of you – that you act justly, love tenderly and walk humbly with your God."

Catechism of the Catholic Church 1906: By 'common good' is to be understood 'the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfilment more fully and more easily.' 1911 'Human interdependence is increasing and gradually spreading throughout the world. The unity of the human family, embracing people who enjoy equal natural dignity, implies a universal common good'.
