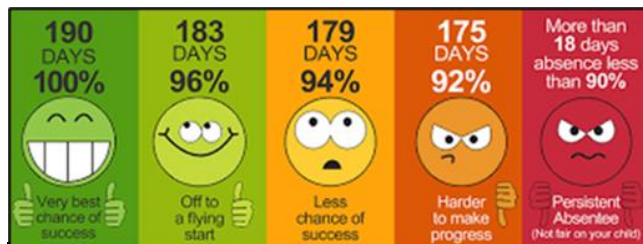


Y5 led the school at our first Whole School Mass today. Parents and carers joined Y5 for tea and biscuits after the service.
