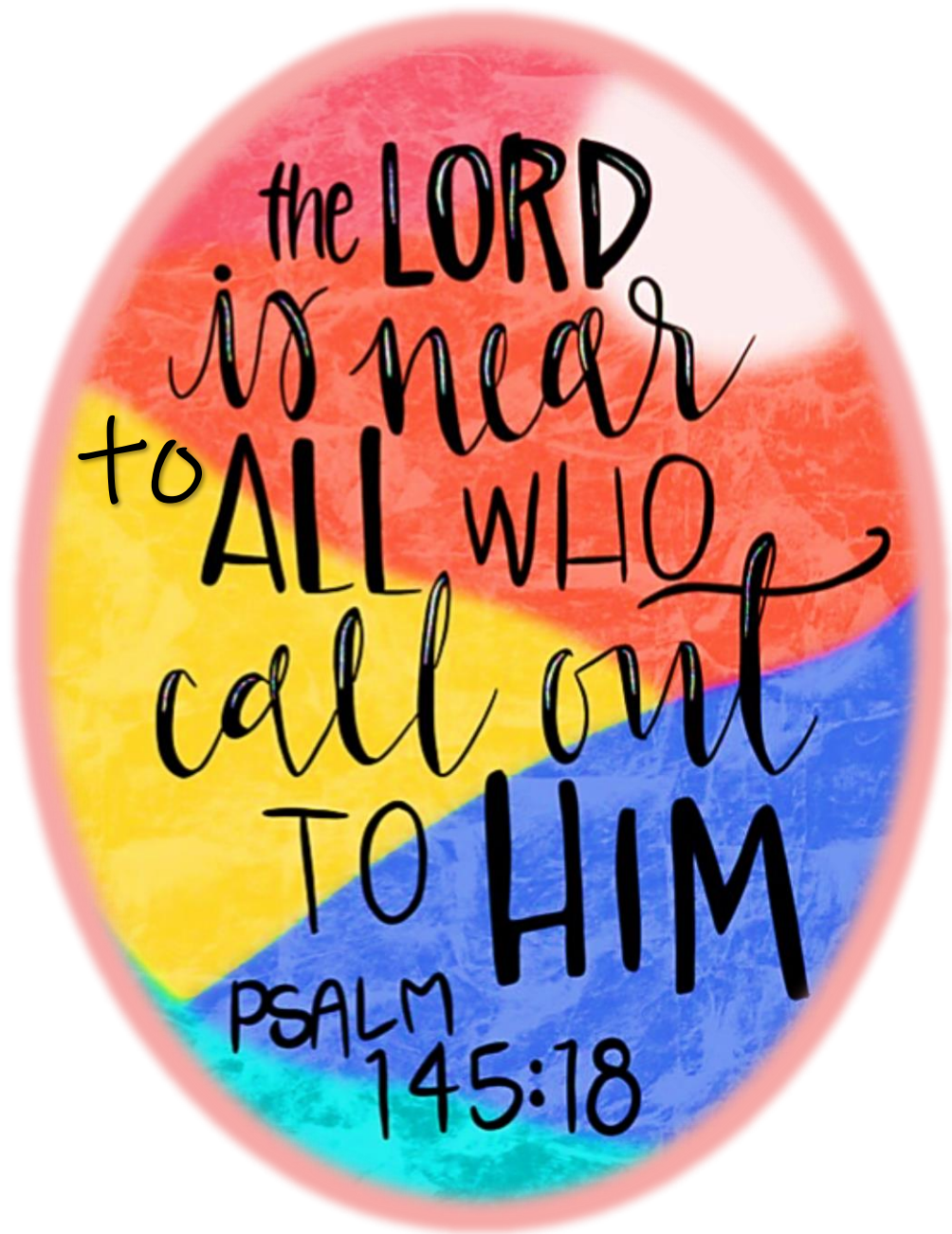

This is another prayer we say to show God we are sorry. It is said during Mass.

I confess to almighty God

through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault;
therefore, I ask blessed Mary, ever-Virgin,
all the Angels and Saints,
and you, my brothers and sisters,
to pray for me to the Lord our God.

The Angelus

This prayer reminds us of when the Angel Gabriel was sent to Mary to tell her that she was going to have baby Jesus - the son of God. Some people say the Angelus three times a day; morning, noon and evening.

Hail Mary, full of grace ...
