On the Friday before the holiday, Reception held an Ugly Bug Ball and invited lots of creepy-crawlies.

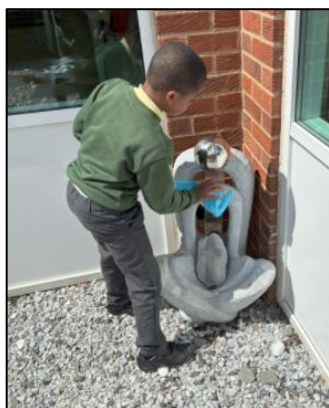

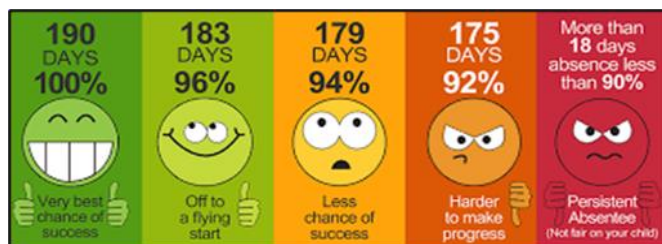


In the midday sunshine on Wednesday, many hands made light work of tidying the Prayer Garden. Teamwork makes the dream work!
