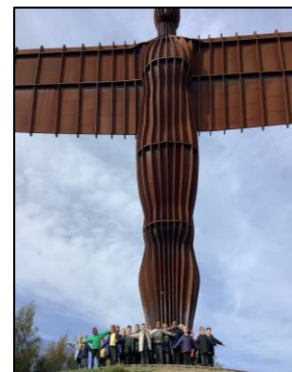
School Half-Term Holiday

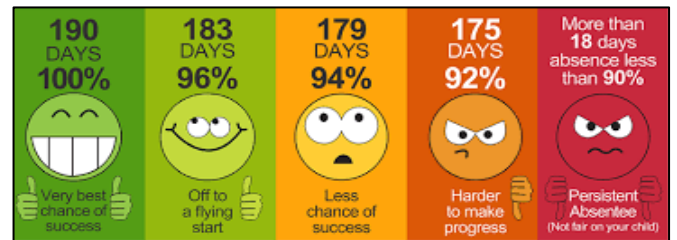
Well done everyone!
