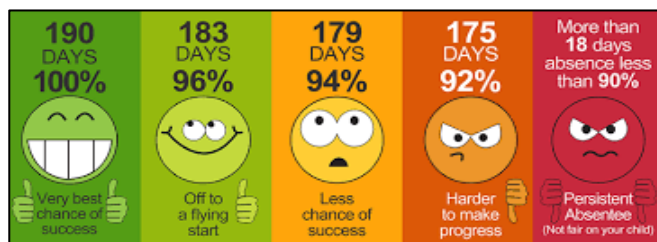
Well done everyone!
