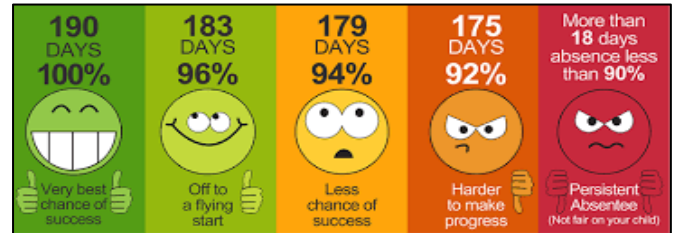


NSPCC workers visited Y5 and Y6 on Tuesday to talk to the children about the support and help they offer children all over the country. They are just a phone call away.
