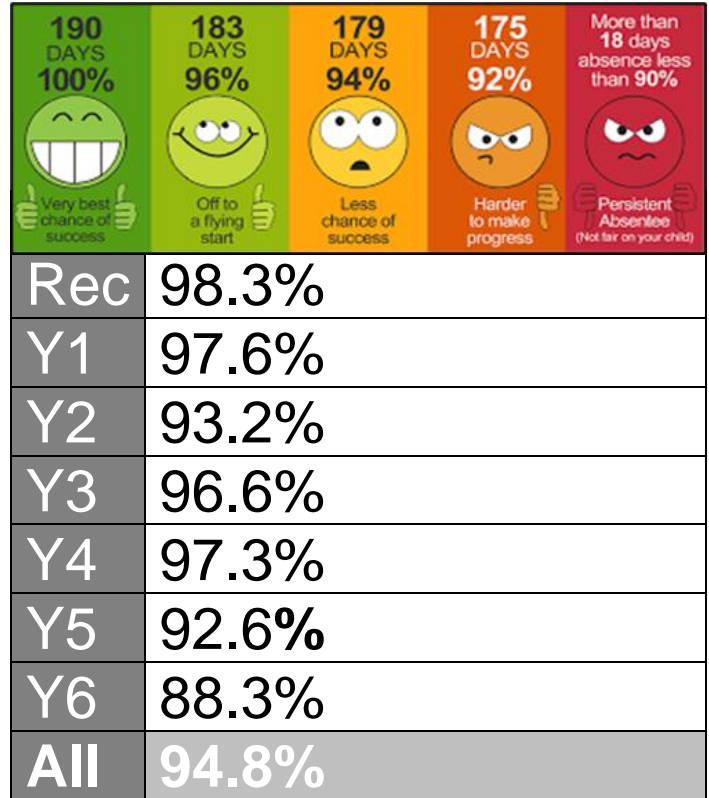
Last week was WINITs rewards week. So, the children who had been saving their winit points splashed-out on an afternoon out-of-school activity.
