On Tuesday, Reception parents and carers were invited to join the class for Stay and Pray on the theme of Friendship: just look at the lovely friendship bracelets they made!



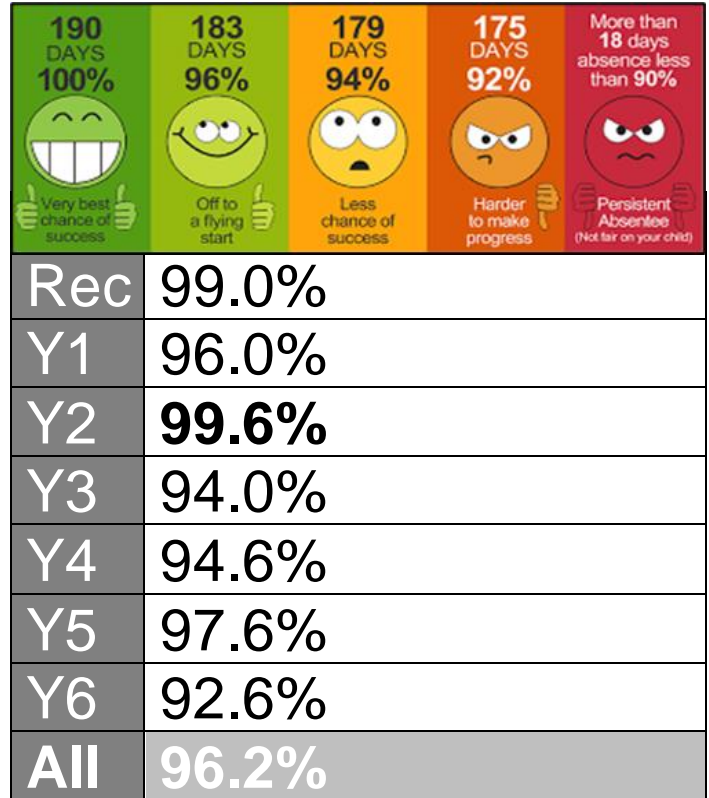
