£30 supermarket vouchers will be issued for all free-school-meal eligible pupils on **Wednesday 18th**.

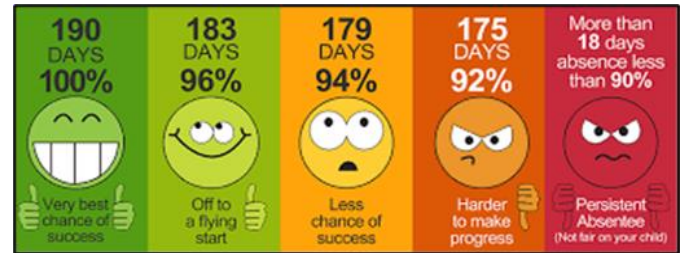
The Festive Season officially kicked-off this week with every St. Vincent's class going to the pantomime... 'Oh no they didn't... Oh, yes they did!'
