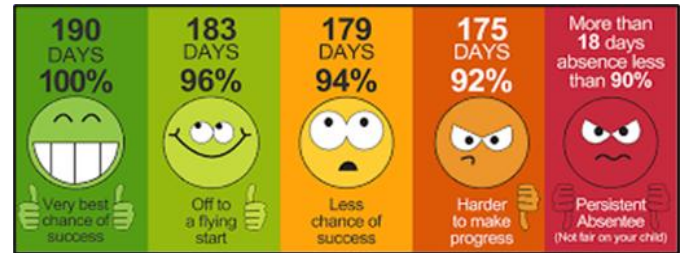


It was just like the January Sales at The Winit's Emporium this week: toys and trinkets were just flying off the shelves!
