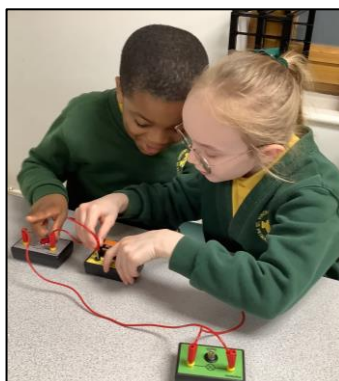

**F**ourteen Y4 pupils received the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Wednesday when they made their First Confession with Fr. Jojo.

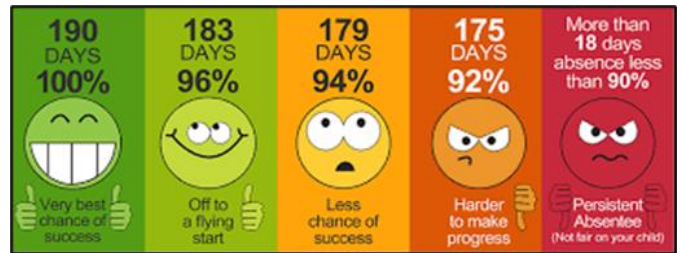


**R**ec invited their parents and carers to stay&play with them on Thursday afternoon: the topic was Number Bonds to Ten.
