Year5: No Poverty

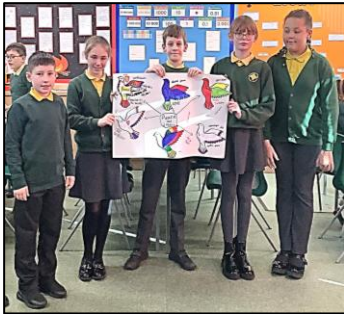
Year6: Peace and Justice
