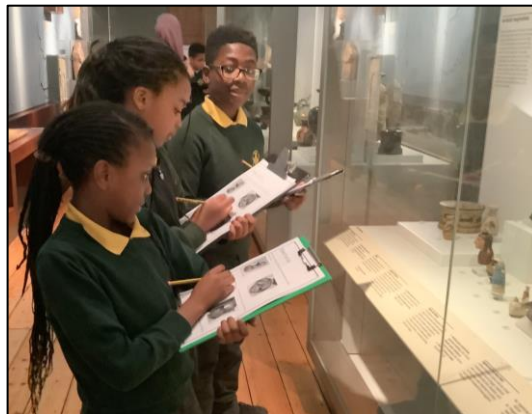

On Thursday, Reception invited their parents and carers to Stay and Pray with them on the theme of Peace.

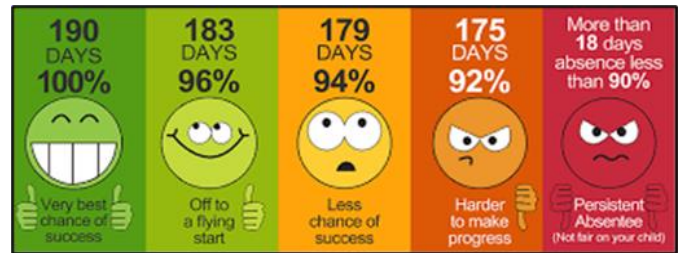
