Y4 joined Y4 pupils from other Newcastle Catholic Primary Schools on Thursday at St. Mary's Cathedral for Stations of The Cross.

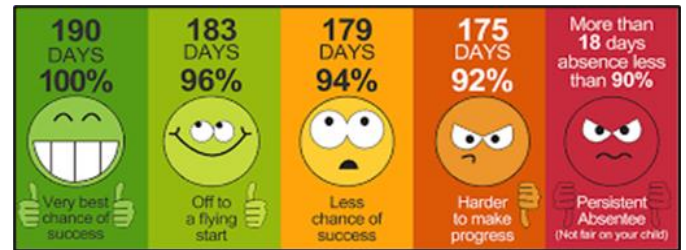


Parents and carers were invited to join Reception pupils on Tuesday afternoon to 'Stay and Play'. The theme was 'reading together'.
