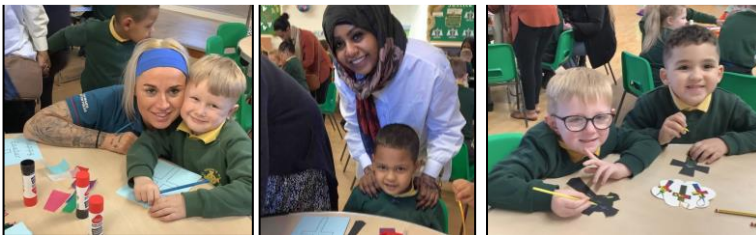

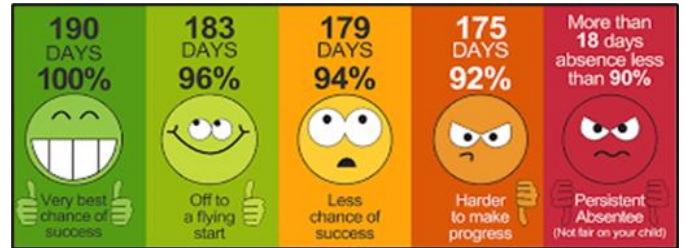
On Tuesday, Reception parents and carers joined the class to Stay & Pray. Together, everyone reflected on this holy season of Lent.
