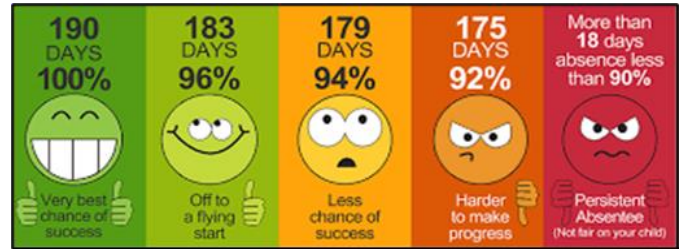
What a fabulous time everyone had at the Easter Discos. 'Thank you' to Mrs Campbell and her team of marvellous mums for ensuring everyone had a great time.
