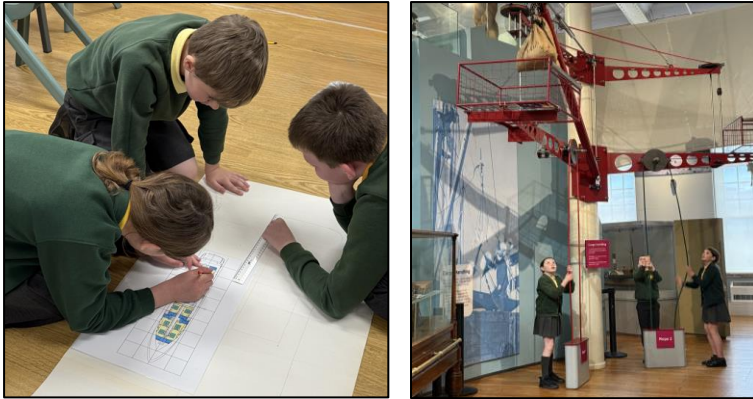
Friday 20th June

Following in the footsteps of Roman soldiers from over 300 years ago, Y4 prepared for an enemy attack at Segedunum on Wednesday.

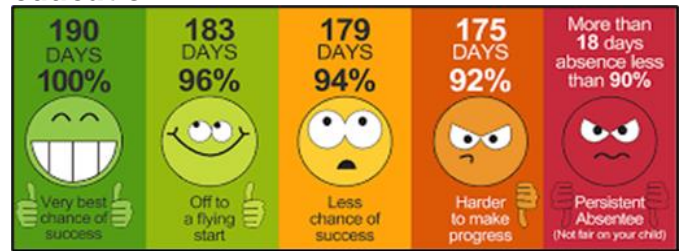


On Tuesday, Y2 exercised their green-fingers when exploring plants and spring flowers at The Rising Sun Country Park
