Pupil Premium Report



At St. Vincent's we have high expectations for our children and we believe that no child should be left behind. We recognise that it is the passion and thirst for knowledge that makes the difference between success and failure at school: not where you come from. Thus, we develop a love of learning in all St. Vincent's pupils so each child has the opportunity to realise their full potential. Pupil Premium funding plays a critical role in supporting the school in achieving this goal. The grant represents a significant proportion of our school budget and this report outlines how we ensure it is spent to maximum impact.

2021-22

In 2020-21 St. Vincent's RC Primary School received a pupil premium grant of £137,900.00

The 2021-22 Pupil Premium grant was used to address three key targets:

- 1. To close the gap between pupils eligible for Pupil Premium funding and those not eligible for the funding.
- 2. To raise academic attainment for pupils receiving Pupil Premium funding.
- 3. To improve attendance for Pupil Premium pupils.

Pupil Premium Spending

Our pupil premium money is used in three fundamental ways:

<u>Intervention</u>: we provide a range of targeted support for our children. Intervention programmes ensure pupils catch-up and keep-up with their peers. In 2021-22 St. Vincent's Intervention Team consisted of 1 qualified teacher, a child-psychotherapist and a home-school coordinator. Pupil Premium funding also pays the salary of an additional Year 6 teacher: this reduces the pupil:teacher ratio and supports rapid progress in academic attainment for our Year 6 pupils.

<u>Learning outside the Classroom</u>: to raise academic attainment and progress the Pupil Premium grant funds a minimum of one Educational Visits per term to develop understanding of the world and to provide inspiration and motivation for learning. In 2021-22, post-Covid19 re-opening allowed this schedule to, with a few adjustments, be reinstated:

Attendance incentives: Our Breakfast Club not only provides a nutritious start to the school day but also provides our families with a convenient and efficient morning routine. Whilst Greggs and British Engines kindly fund the food for our daily Breakfast Club, the Pupil Premium grant partially pays the wages of the 5 employees who run the club. Breakfast Club continued during the pandemic lockdown to support key worker and vulnerable families. Additionally, the school's attendance reward scheme is funded by the Pupil Premium grant.

IMPACT

Closing the gap & raising achievement for Pupil Premium pupils:

63% of St. Vincent's pupils are eligible for Pupil Premium (PP) funding. Summer 2022 statutory test results reflect the impact of 2 years disrupted schooling due to Covid19. However, all pupils received focused intervention for both academic and emotional/mental health support in 2021-22.

There were 30 Y6 pupils. Three were new to St. Vincent's in Y5 – one from overseas with limited English. Additionally, 1 pupil had significant spells of absence due to a serious medical condition. All 4 pupils received Pupil Premium funding.

20 of the 30 children in Y6 were eligible for PP funding: 67%

All test results are above 2022 National Averages, with PP pupil percentages for the expected standard being above or inline with the 2022 national average.

Similarly, PP pupils' results for all statutory tests demonstrate comparable attainment with non-pp pupils. Indeed, Y1 and Y4 pupil premium results exceeded those on non-PP pupils.

2021-22 end-of-year data analysis informs that pupils who received tailored intervention programmes made good or better progress. Thus, pupils operating at a slower pace were given support to catch-up with their peers, whilst individuals experiencing specific short-term difficulties were supported to ensure they did not fall behind.

<u>Improving attendance</u>: Breakfast Club has played a critical role in St. Vincent's improving attendance and punctuality data. The introduction of the Winits incentive scheme in 2016 continues to be both popular and effective. However, with continued absences due to Covid19 and self-isolation regulations, our 2021-22 attendance data fell below our traditionally high standard.

2022-23

For 2021-22 it is anticipated that St. Vincent's RC Primary School will receive a Pupil Premium Grant of £177,801.00

This grant will be used to:

- further raise the academic achievement of PP eligible pupils
- further narrow the attainment gap between PP eligible pupils and non-PP pupils
- further improve the attendance of PP eligible pupils

These targets will be met by:

- ✓ providing a range of targeted support for children to ensure they catch-up and keep-up with their peers. For 2022 -23 St. Vincent's Intervention Team will be led by:
 - 1 experienced teacher to manage and monitor academic progress and achievement
 - 1 child-psychotherapist to support and supervise pupils' mental and emotional wellbeing
 - 1 home-school coordinator to guide, inform and support parents/carers
- ✓ employ an additional teacher to support our continuing catch-up schedule
- ✓ providing regular opportunities to learn outside the classroom. Each class will engage in, at least, one Educational Visit each half term to inspire and motivate learning: including residential trips for Y4, Y5 and Y6
- ✓ providing a daily nutritious breakfast: free of charge and at a convenient time for parents (7:30am start)
- ✓ running an attendance incentive programme
